Training

At Country Energy, the safety of our employees and apprentices is paramount. Using a mentoring approach, apprentices are supervised in every aspect of their work to ensure that they are not exposed to any hazardous situations. Safety training is a priority for the organisation; both employees and apprentices are continually updated on safety best practices.



Benefits and Conditions

Apprenticeships are for a 4 year term unless otherwise stated and the ordinary hours of work are 36 per week to be worked in an eight hour day, over a nine day fortnight. (employees have a Rostered Day off once a fortnight).

Country Energy provides job security, challenging work and a friendly work environment. We also offer a competitive salary package, including 13% superannuation and a range of attractive award allowances. Each apprentice is also provided with a Country Energy uniform and tool kit at commencement of their employment.
